Background

VIN has been organizing workcamps in Jitpur community for the development of different field. On the month of July, VIN organized 2 workcamps which received 19 volunteers altogether from different part

of the world. On the month of August, VIN had only one workcamp project where VIN received 3 international volunteers. This is a report of 2 weeks workcamp of 'Stop Open defection campaign.'

VIN started its work in jitpurphedi community with different objectives. One of the objectives was to make the community Open Defecation free sector because through the baseline survey, 40%-50% of the households in Jitpur community was not access to permanent toilet. VIN started to support the local people with an aim to prepare a toilet in each house. VIN intends to achieve "stool-free" (Open Defecation Free) status for Jitpur Phedi, with each family having access to and being motivated to use a toilet. The implementation of the **Stop Open**



Defecation Campaign is expected to generate a significant improvement in the health and sanitation conditions of the community, observable as a reduction in the occurrence of sickness within the community and an improved quality of life. Using toilets in Nepal has been a recent phenomenon.

The workcamp started on the 4th of august to 17th of august, 2013 with an aim to complete some toilet in Aapchaur community. The workcamp took place in a small community where 5 households were access to only one toilet. The workcamp aimed to benefit the four houses.

Objectives

VIN has been sponsoring the local people to make toilets in the community since 2009. By the end of 2013, VIN has supported to build over 130 toilets in the community. The objectives of 'Stop Open defecation campaign 2013' are:

- To construct toilets to the needy households.
- To raise awareness on health and sanitation and to community people.
- To Stop Open Defecation.
- To promote friendship, understanding and solidarity among local people and international workcampers.
- To develop cultural immersion

Major Activities:

 - stone collecting
 - making hole

Methodology:



The workcamp was scheduled with different activities. On the very first step, the workcampers were given a brief introduction about the organization and the workcamp. They were told briefly about the


nature of the work. They were also given some information about the host family. Then on the second day workcamper were taken to the working area 'Aapchaur' and were introduced with the families they will be working with. They started their work on the same day.

The main work was to dig the hole for the toilet and to aware people of the community on why they need toilets. Along with that the workcampers were also interested in learning the culture of the community. They explained that they had a good time with the




community and learned a lot of culture of Nepal.
